RESIDENTIAL CURB REBATE PROGRAM

The City of Lima has approximately 150 miles of streets. Curbs in good repair not only function as a collection point for storm water, but give neighborhoods an orderly and attractive appearance. New curbs actually increase the value of one's property.

It is the responsibility of the property owner to maintain curbs but the City of Lima, as an extra incentive to replace worn out curbs, offers a rebate program.

Here's How It Works:

1. The property owner finds their own contractor to replace the curb in front of their property. It is recommended that several quotes be sought.
2. A permit must be secured from the City of Lima Building and Permits Office by the owner or the contractor on behalf of the owner. This allows City Inspectors to discuss all specifications for new curb and grade.
3. The contractor shall call the permit office for the appropriate inspections and once work is complete, the City Inspector will process paperwork to initiate the rebate payment.
4. Payment will be mailed to the owner in approximately two to four weeks after the final inspection.

How Much Will I Receive?

The City rebates are on a \$5.00 per linear foot basis. Therefore, if you are replacing 50' of curb, you will receive \$250 toward your curb replacement project.

Can Whole Neighborhoods Participate?

Sure! Many times neighbors will secure quotes from several contractors to replace the curb in an entire block. Rebate checks will be made separately to each owner.
